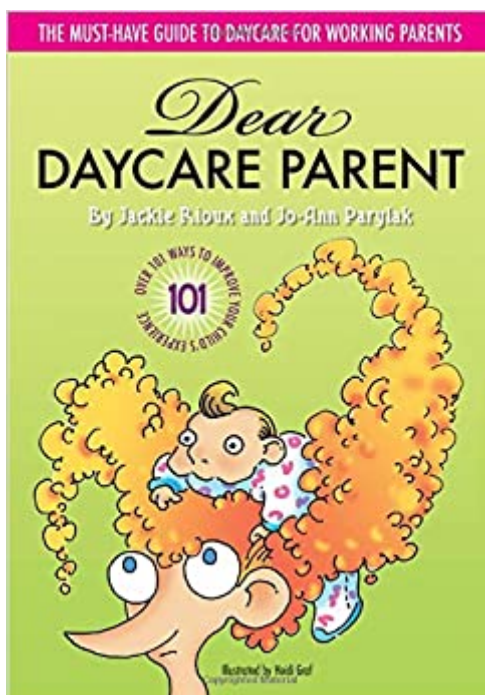


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# Dear Daycare Parent

I bought this book for my cousin who recently gave birth to their first child. This book does a great job of capturing many of the emotions and decisions that go into sending your child to a daycare. A lot of the information is "common sense," but it never seems that obvious when you're in the middle of dealing with it. I haven't had my own kids in daycare for 18 years, but this book brought back all the issues of dealing with sending your child to daycare. I forgot how stressful daycare could be (especially the guilt you feel when you drop off your child). This book does a nice job of succinctly discussing each topic; I found many of the real-life examples mirrored my own experiences. This is a nice resource for new parents.

I bought this for a baby shower gift but of course, I read it first! It is a great reference for anyone who currently uses or anticipates using day care. This book takes all the guesswork out of what to expect from your daycare facilities and why they do what they do. Each topic has a 'Why is This

Important' section, to explain in plain English the reason for the key points listed. The 'Real Life Examples' are worth the price of the book alone. Whether you have one or five kids in daycare, have never used daycare before, or have been using daycare for years - this book is a valuable tool.
