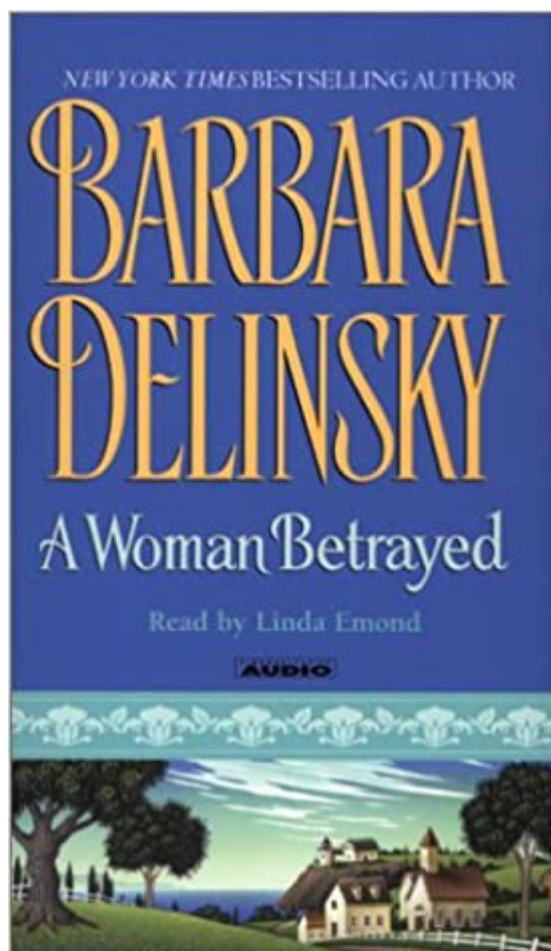

Delinsky's (Facets) diverting page-turner focuses on the disintegration of a woman's picture-perfect, well-managed existence. Thirty-eight-year-old Laura Frye seems to have it all: a hardworking CPA husband, two teenagers of only average rebelliousness, a successful restaurant and catering business and a beautiful home in western Massachusetts. When her husband Jeff vanishes without a trace, she's convinced there's been foul play. But six nightmarish days after her husband disappears, an IRS agent appears at their door: Jeff is being investigated for tax fraud. Daphne Phillips, Laura's friend and lawyer, offers support, but can't stop the IRS from freezing Jeff and Laura's assets--including the funds she needs to keep her restaurant afloat--nor can she protect Laura from the local newspaper that seems viciously bent on exploiting her problems. When Laura's just about ready to crack, who should breeze in but the very man she's least prepared to cope with: Christian, Jeff's charismatic brother, the family's black sheep and, long ago, Laura's first

This was a book filled with a bunch of not nice, and unbelievable people. Spoiler alert -if you don't want to know what happens, read no further!
Maddie (mother) - totally inhuman the way she criticized her daughter when she was down and out
Lydia (beloved mother-in-law) who allowed her husband to mentally abuse her first son and crippled the second to the point that he became a deserter and a criminal
Debra - hateful teenage daughter who needed someone to straighten her out - fast!
Scott - did no one care that he was so promiscuous?
Daphne - not even a bit realistic. What successful lawyer tries to work on a case while naked in bed with a guy who can't get enough of her.
Jeff - a cypher to all, including this reader. Doesn't even have the nerve to tell his wife what he needs but then does have the nerve to commit fraud, adultery and desertion.
Christian - bad boy suddenly becomes a saint AND a hero!
Laura - clueless perfectionist - not a sympathetic character. Leaves her daughter with her nasty and preoccupied mother to go off with her brother-in-law. While she is gone, her 16 year old daughter is raped.
Not recommended.

After reading "Lake News," I scanned the reviews of other books by Barbara Delinsky and picked this book from the list. This is a well developed plot with some interesting twists and turns. It is easy to run away from problems, but what of the people left behind who have to contend with them and clean up the mess. When Laura's husband disappears without a trace (even the IRS and FBI can't find him), her life starts to unravel as she adds up the bills, encounters tax problems and frozen assets, and discovers that she has no personal credit rating. After 20 years of marriage, she finds she never really knew her husband, and was unaware of the real source of some of his income. Various things are dredged up from the past including the emotional abuse that some people endured as children. As Laura struggles to maintain her own career and business while dealing with her family, an old friendship is lost but an old love is rekindled. It is a difficult book to put down when

you get involved in the plot.

A very interesting story that captured me on the first page. Several storylines within the story kept the intrigue. It ended very well. A satisfying reading experience.
