

Powell presents all of this with clarity and precision by weaving nearly 2,000 primary accounts with his own cogent analysis. The result is a rich and deep portrait of the fighting and command relationships on a scale never before attempted or accomplished. His upcoming third volume, Analysis of a Barren Victory, will conclude the set with careful insight into the fighting and its impact on the war, Powellâ ™s detailed research into the strengths and losses of the two armies, and an exhaustive bibliography. Powellâ ™s magnum opus, complete with original maps, photos, and illustrations, is the culmination of many years of research and study, coupled with a complete understanding of the battlefieldâ ™s complex terrain system. For any student of the Civil War in general, or the Western Theater in particular, Powellâ ™s trilogy is a must-read.

Following the superb vol. 1, this one provides no surprises. It is equally well-done - writing, analysis, use of terrain, etc. In short, all of the crucial elements of a model operational and tactical study are here, backed up by excellent maps. For example only, the author tackles the 150-year-old controversy over Tom Wood's handling of the "close up" order from Rosecrans directly, thoroughly, and definitively. Even casual students who might on its face find the size of this study daunting will be more than happy if they nonetheless take the plunge and buy it.

While it is certainly a well-written book, you must be a rabid enthusiast of Civil War battle minutiae to really be able to follow the vast details of the people and places involved in the battle. I have visited and worked in the area of Chickamauga, Chattanooga, Ringgold, Flinstone and other surrounding areas, but will have to pay a more extended visit in the near future to the battlefield grounds, so that I can put all of this newly gained knowledge to work identifying the places named in the book. All of this being said, I read the book cover to cover and enjoyed it very much. I will definitely read the entire series after I return from Chickamauga.

Excellent book. I have to reread a number of chapters to keep the principle characters straight but I have learned so very much about the area a few miles North of where I grew up. So many things I did not know about my ancestors.

OK...I'm biased since I roomed with Dave in college, but his ability to put you in the shoes of a regimental or brigade commander is unrivalled. I never knew much about this battle, but after reading his three books, I can now see why the US Army studies this battle so intently. This is a great battle to study if you want to see how lessons learned were either ignored or discovered and how some tactical brilliance saved portions of the army from obliteration.
