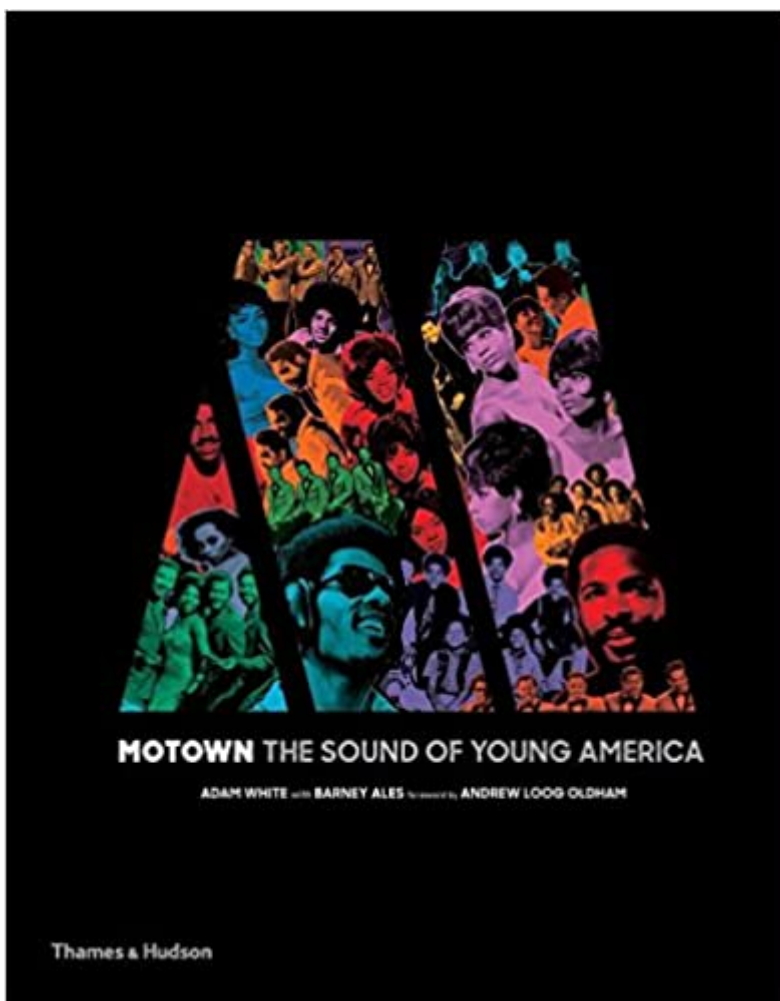

Adam White has written about music for more than forty years. He scripted the Grammy-nominated radio documentary *The Motown Story*, was editor-in-chief at *Billboard*, and coauthored *The Billboard Book of No. 1 R&B Hits*. He was vice president of communications at Universal Music Group International from 2002 to 2012. Barney Ales was Berry Gordy's right-hand man. Ales rose to become executive vice president and then served as its president from 1975 to 1978. Andrew Loog Oldham is a record producer, talent manager and author.
