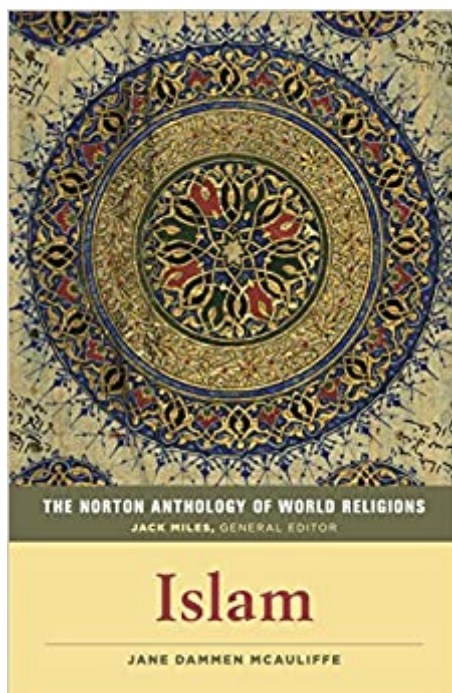

Jane Dammen McAuliffe (Ph.D. University of Toronto), the inaugural director of National and International Outreach at the Library of Congress, is the editor of the six-volume *Encyclopaedia of*

the Quran and the Cambridge Companion to the Quran. She is a former president of Bryn Mawr College and a former dean of arts and sciences at Georgetown University. Jack Miles (Ph.D. Harvard) is Distinguished Professor of English and Religious Studies with the University of California at Irvine and Senior Fellow for Religious Affairs with the Pacific Council on International Policy. He spent 1960-70 as a Jesuit seminarian, studying at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome and the Hebrew University in Jerusalem before enrolling at Harvard University, where he completed a Ph.D. in Near Eastern languages in 1971. His book GOD: A Biography won a Pulitzer Prize in 1996, and Christ: A Crisis in the Life of God led to his being named a MacArthur Fellow for 2003-07.

A great selection of readings on the whole. Minority and majority opinions appear as equals. Very useful biographies before each selection. Some oddities and problems: A bit Arab and Persian-centric. Of course there is no way to avoid that fully as that is where the scholarship is, but still... Most of the selected readings on women were written by men as if there aren't thousands of women scholars who could have been selected. The image on the cover is upside-down and backwards. The means of transliteration changes from selection to selection, which can get a little confusing for students. An unnecessary number of pages are spent on pronunciations. Naturally these are difficult sometimes, but most of them refer to either names that just come up once in passing or words that appear dozens of times across the book.

A comprehensive, insightful, and well-selected anthology of Islam that brings together 66 important texts. The editor introduces the authors of the texts with very helpful short biographies. It covers a broad spectrum from foundational texts to recent debates.
