

I came to this book because of research I am doing on symbiosis and microorganisms and a growing fascination with all things tiny and weird that keep our ecosystem thriving. Eugenia Bone is a compatible, sometimes funny, honest knowledgeable guide to a beginner in the world of

mushrooms and all things fungus. I loved learning about the sociology of mushroom people, how to (and how not to) grow mushrooms in your apartment. How the world is permeated with fungi (yes, I am a bit creeped out knowing that everything has fungi in it!). And how wondrous the world is and how tied together by mushroom threads, fungal spores, etc. we are. Also a lot of fun are the cultural takes and attitudes about mushrooms. I have travelled in Eastern Europe a lot and mushroom hunting is a sacred skill, sadly disappearing as a younger generation prefers texting and computers, which aren't bad in themselves, but it is a loss that the knowledge is disappearing. These folks got most of their minerals from mushrooms! In any case, the book is great to just learn about mushrooms in a grand general sense and to look at the world from a totally new perspective.

This is a book with multiple areas of interest. Eugenia Bone starts out not knowing a thing about mushrooms except that they grow on people's lawns. The reader can follow her personal growth in "mushroomology" and learn a thing or two as well. Bone investigates the nature of a mushroom foray - like what goes on at these things besides a walk in the woods and a collection of mushrooms? She investigates psychotropic mushrooms - what does high really mean and does it have any value whatsoever other than getting high? . Is the mushroom really useful from a medical point of view? Or, what about environmental remediation using fungus???? This book is immenently readable and fascinating. I'd recommend it to anyone who starts out being who's interested in mushrooms.
