

Bette Davis gives an open and honest analysis of her personal life and career during the Golden Years of Hollywood. Though some of her actions and opinions may seem very non-PC to 21st century readers, her attitudes about being valued as a woman with a career and children were ahead of their time. She does not describe the lonely life of an artist to generate empathy or garner pity, but to explain her understanding of what must be sacrificed when one gives herself over to her art. There is no doubt Bette Davis made this sacrifice willingly and felt great satisfaction in her accomplishments. We, her audience, are the beneficiaries.

Bette Davis was the first one to tell her story via a ghost writer and it certainly wouldn't be the last time. Released in 1962, this book was tailored for its time and moral sensibilities. It may not tell the full story, but it is an interesting story nevertheless. Once I started this book, I could not put it down. One thing is certain, Bette Davis was never boring - ever!

If you are looking for some salacious tide bits, they are not here. But it is a good place to understand what kind of person she was and how and why she fought the studio system and paved the way for many other actresses who came after her and were able to win the battle for independence and more say in choosing the parts. She has some interesting musings about life, marriage, love and work as an actress. I really enjoyed reading this in her own words. Entertaining and enlightening.
