

While the material is cute, it is short and very basic. Those with knowledge of the Aleph - Bet and a few basic words should be able to follow the material but don't expect a full blown Hebrew course by any means.

Just downloaded on loan on Prime account. Is there there a typo in the first chapter? The words 'shlomchah' and 'schlomech' are used. Michael uses the phrase 'ma shlomchah' when he addressing Asaf. She responds and uses 'ma schlomech' when she makes the same inquiry of him. Should these phrases be reversed, e. g. Michael using 'schlomech' when inquiring of Asap and vice versa? My understanding is that 'schlomech' is used when addressing a woman. Do I have it wrong? Have only taken cursory view of book, but this caught my attention. Will write a review and rate after I have completed my review.
