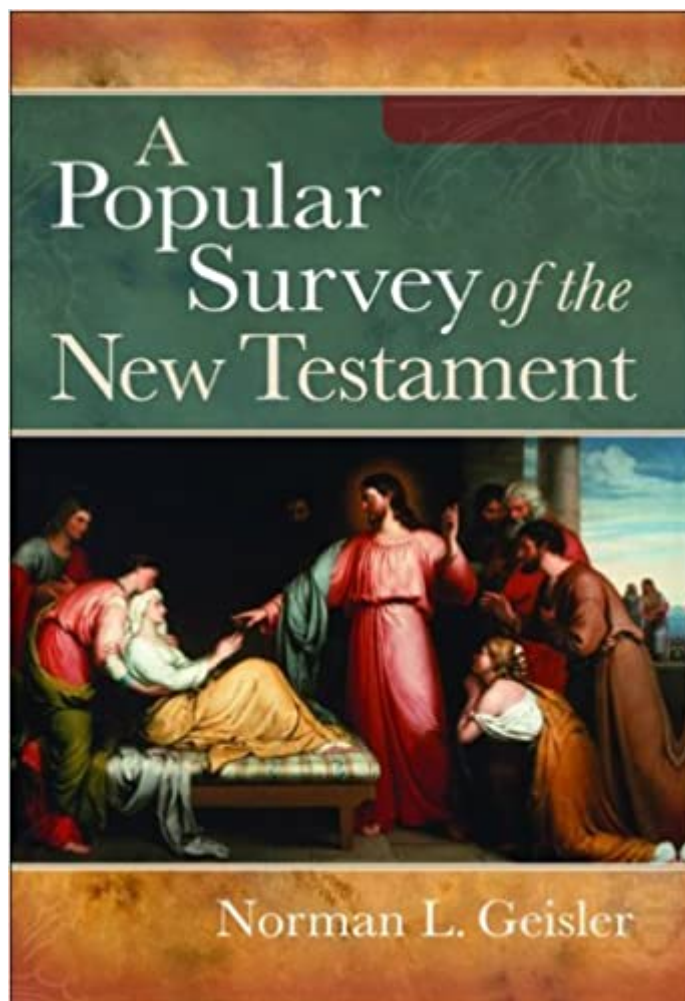

Geisler, dean of Southern Evangelical Seminary and Bible College, and author of more than 70 books dealing with the Bible and Christianity, gathers decades of findings of New Testament scholars into a truly accessible and readable overview, aimed at readers at all levels. Of all the Bible survey tools, I have used this one to cite more times than any other in my college research projects and papers.

The book is quite good, but I'm not convinced of its overall usefulness in this day and age. Each chapter is divided into 2 general sections. The first section is a summary of key points about the Bible book like author, date, and major themes. The second section is a collection of questions people might raise about potential conflicts or inaccuracies in the specific Bible book. That section

seemed useful, but the section summarizing key elements of the Bible book can be found in a good reference/study Bible. That means you'd have all that information at your fingertips without having to carry along an extra book.
