


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# Laryngeal Electromyography





### Synopsis

Laryngeal Electromyography is a reference tool for laryngologists, neurologists, physiatrists, and other electrophysiologists interested in adding laryngeal electromyography to their clinical practice. A procedure that evaluates the integrity of the muscular and nervous systems of the larynx, laryngeal electromyography is an important but underused procedure that allows for accurate laryngologic diagnosis. This book provides voice care professionals with information on the science, history, and clinical application of this important assessment and treatment procedure.
