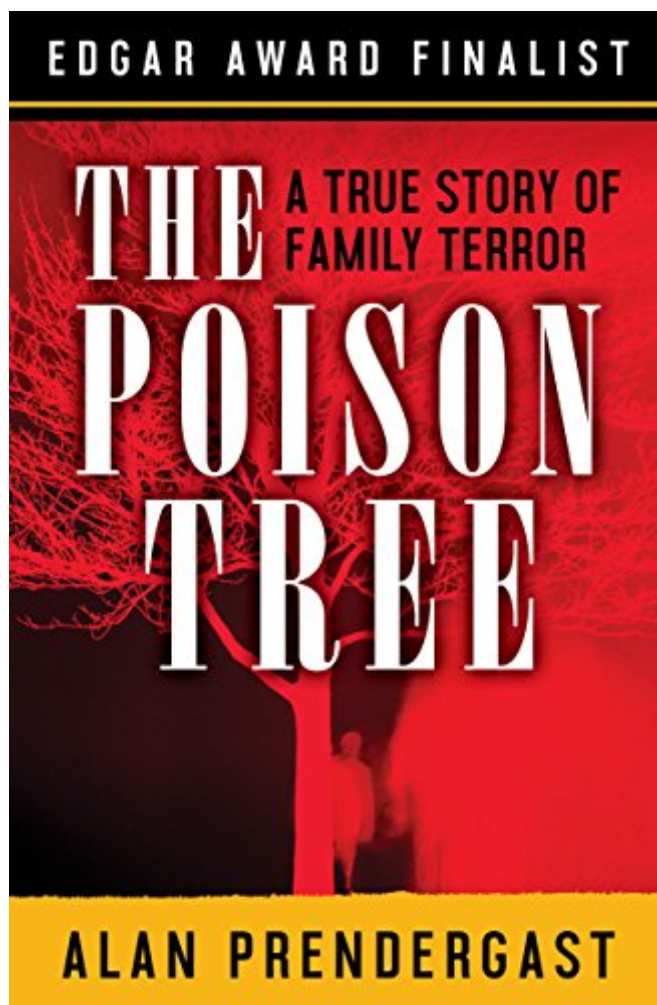

This true case helped change child abuse cases in Wyoming and U.S. Hard to read, but important to realize that just because there are laws, it doesn't mean they may be applied in all cases.
