

Because Preacher Man is all about forgetting what would happen IRL and just enjoying the story. So ignore the fact that Luis would never REALLY be able to get a steering wheel off a police car with his bare hands or that he's the only man in America who doesn't know what a sermon is. Just

enjoy the ride, because it's a hella lot of fun. This is, essentially, a very sweet story, about Luis rolling into Tinytown, USA, impersonating a pastor even though he's never even set foot in a church before. The townspeople are very welcoming, although we suspect a lot of them have caught onto the scam and just aren't saying anything. Part of the humor is Luis's constant scheming to leave town before his past catches up with him. First he tries to "borrow" a car from various people (and his interior monologue about it, "is this theft? if so, how serious is it if it's not grand theft auto?"), then he decides a riding a horse across the desert is the way to go (even though he's never been on one in his life), and then he settles on flying out in a duct-taped plane with the town drunk. In between, he fumblingly performs his pastoral duties and manages to get a few things right. This is all great good fun, and I can't remember the last time a book surprised me so much. In a good way. Highly recommended.

I nominated this book during its Kindle Scout campaign and received a free reviewer's copy.And...
I'm glad that I did. This is a sweet rom-com with a Christian message. The 'hero' Luis is a small time con-man who is plopped into small town where the townsfolk mistake him for their new preacher.

Deep down he's actually a decent guy. Now, stuck in the middle of nowhere, and hiding out from both the law and criminal elements, he allows the charade to continue. While he envisions various means to plot his 'escape', he is naturally drawn into the lives of many different townsfolk and they effect each other's lives for the better. Often humorously. Perhaps it is a tad predictable, or the town seems a tad too trusting... but I'd like to believe that there are still small towns like this where you feel as if you've been transported 30 years back in time.Highly recommended if you want a sweet, feel-good story with a Christian theme. Pleasant, easy read.

This is the spiritual journey of Luis, a small-time criminal caught in larger plot. While fleeing to survive, he discovers a new side to himself. The story is sometimes humorous, sometimes touching, You will fall in love with the town and its people, and discover true miracles exist.

I didn't know what to expect when I started reading this book. That is not to say it is not predictable but how the author portrays the hero and the people around him. I found it to be humorous in certain places and the main character grows on you. Would recommend.
