


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Teach From Love: School Year Devotional For Families

This may be the most important homeschool book you ever buy. (Though I encourage any parent to buy it-- we're all our children's first teachers.) Nothing matters more than our kids' characters. It's something we all say, and yet rarely do anything about. This book provides a structure to make sure you have an important conversation with your children every single school day. Each devotional includes a verse focusing on a certain aspect of two character traits being studied for that week. I love the depth in the body of each devotional. I enjoy reading them as an adult and my young kids love the content and questions. It is so refreshing to find a simple option that still provide context for character traits that can me instantly grasped and prompts deep discussions. I'm sure we will use this devotional for more than one year-- possibly as prompts for short essays based on each day's topic in future years. I absolutely also recommend reading Sam Sorbo's book about homeschooling "They're Your Kids." Sam homeschools for all the right reasons and is one of the most passionate voices for homeschooling today.

The cover's open because I just got this book delivered and had to stop right as I opened it to look through it. I read the Forward and the Welcome and skimmed several of the devotionals. Wow. So awesome! I LOVE the arrangement and the ability to share with your children in open discussion and I've loved the entries I've skimmed! I can't wait to start! You must buy!

At one time as an educator for nearly forty years and a loyal member of local, state and teacher associations (before they became like unions) I was very opposed to home schooling and a voucher system. However over the past twenty years I have become appalled at education in our nation as so many schools are failing to provide real learning. Too many teachers from grade school on up to the college level seem to feel they have a responsibility to indoctrinate young minds with their views about society, politics and government. And there has been a growing tendency to want to turn over curriculum planning to the Federal government. I had the opportunity to review one of the best books ever written on home schooling, on education for that matter, written by Sam Sorbo. Her book They're Your Kids traced her journey of being one who doubted to a true believer. The book was also kind of a how to book, how to do the research and get the resources for taking over the education of your children. Now I am not saying there are not good public schools our there, I know of many great ones and I applaud the teachers and administrators who are making a difference. And who are not permitting their schools to become socialist training grounds. Mrs. Sorbo has done it again. She has come up with a marvelous book Teach From Love. It is a daily devotional for use by parents who home school. I also encourage its use by public school teachers who would like to

see morality and virtue brought back. I would love to see this book in the classroom, at least for the opportunity to discuss the handling of issues we are faced with in every day life. For example one of the lessons is titled â ÂœWise Choiceâ Â• and the reading deals with how hard it is to make a choice to do the right thing. Too often in today's society we are urged to serve ourselves and not family, friends or God who should be first. As an old school guy myself I remember in the fifties that each morning a student would volunteer to read a few Bible verses and lead the class in prayer. Jewish students also participated using readings they brought in. My favorite was a young man who brought in a ram's horn for a call to worship. You can imagine how that sounded down the hall way of a school. We all learned from such sessions. Teach From Love, which is introduced by Kevin Sorbo, covers each day of school Monday through Friday starting with a Bible verse and then a lesson. There is a short prayer at the end of each with questions. Each week like each day had a title and at the end of the week an Annotationy with a place to write your thoughts and feelings. This is not just like a textbook, it is also designed for note taking. It is a book that encourages critical thinking. Holidays and special events are also covered. Unlike most books in this category I found that one read through is not enough. The book itself is one that fulfills the need for Bible Study and it could well be used by every family. Thank you Sam Sorbo, this is highly recommended for all.
